Challenges in accessing funding

- High demand: More need than available funding.
- Local funds: Flood projects don't typically generate revenue and many communities do not have steady revenue streams to fund flood projects. Communities struggle to generate funds for local match requirements or loan repayment.
- Complex or burdensome application or program requirements and prolonged timelines of funding programs.
